A block of rooms has been reserved at the Embassy Suites by Hilton Crystal City-National Airport in Arlington, VA. The hotel is situated just 1 mile from Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport, 3 blocks from the Pentagon City Metro Station, and 4 miles from historic sites of Downtown Washington DC. Complimentary shuttle service is provided between the Airport and the hotel. The hotel provides a complimentary cooked-to-order breakfast, a complimentary evening reception with drinks and light snacks, a fitness center, an indoor pool and whirlpool, and a business center.
