Tellus introduces the service OnlineEarly

Tellus has decided to introduce the service OnlineEarly. It is a service that has been added to the Online Journals service known as Synergy. The purpose is to electronically publish complete and final articles before they are printed in the paper versions of *Tellus*.

The articles will always be identical to the subsequent printed version – the only difference is that the printed version will contain page numbers and volume/issue information, and if necessary, some minimal rearrangement of white space/figures for print purposes. The content will be entirely unaltered. For copyright purposes, the PDF version mounted online is considered the definitive version rather than the full-text HTML. Once an article is published using the OnlineEarly service, it can not be changed unless the normal erratum process is followed.

Although OnlineEarly articles do not have bibliographic information associated with them (i.e. volume/issue numbers, page ranges), they can still be cited by means of their DOI (Digital Object Identifier). This number will stay with the article throughout its life, even when it has been published in a print issue. Therefore, citations that were made before an article was published in print will still enable readers to access the article when it has been moved to its final issue.
